



Marble is a natural material of unique beauty, whose tones, veins and patterns result from geological processes spanning thousands of years.

As such, each block is singular and may present unpredictable variations, giving character and uniqueness to the furniture it is used in.

It is important to note that any visual representation serves as a guide, but does not always correspond to the actual finish. The veins, fissures and colour intensity vary in each extraction and even within the same slab.







Nero Marquina

Given its natural delicacy, it is ideal for details and statement surfaces, such as furniture tops with proper support. An excellent choice to bring depth and personality to an interior.




Examples of the variations in patterns and veins of the Nero Marquina.




Dark Emperador

Dark Emperador stands out for its warm tones and deep nuances. It features a complex network of light veins, in shades ranging from beige to hazelnut.

Examples of the variations in patterns and veins of the Dark Emperador.




Verde Alpi




Estremoz


Black Flower

This is a dynamic and visually impactful marble, capable of transforming any decor. However, its delicate nature requires extra care when applied to furniture and in daily use.




Examples of the variations in patterns and veins of the Black Flower.




Cappuccino




Carrara

Examples of the variations in patterns and veins of the Carrara.




Rosso Levanto
